# God's K.N.E.W. normal #4 Blessings or Punishment

Luke 12:41-48

Peter said, "Lord, are You addressing this parable to us, or to everyone else as well?" And the Lord said, "Who then is the faithful and sensible steward, whom his master will put in charge of his servants, to give them their rations at the proper time?

Blessed is that slave whom his master finds so doing when he comes. Truly I say to you that he will put him in charge of all his possessions. But if that slave says in his heart, 'My master will be a long time in coming,' and begins to beat the slaves, both men and women, and to eat and drink and get drunk; the master of that slave will come on a day when he does not expect him and at an hour he does not know, and will cut him in pieces, and assign him a place with the unbelievers.

And that slave who knew his master's will and did not get ready or act in accord with his will, will receive many lashes, but the one who did not know it, and committed deeds worthy of a flogging, will receive but few. From everyone who has been given much, much will be required; and to whom they entrusted much, of him they will ask all the more.

## Four Analogies of Readiness.

- Have your loins girded up.
- Get Your Lamps Lit.
- Be like servants ready when the master returns
- Be like a householder knowing a thief's coming, just not when, so ready all the time.

"Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking into the sky? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in just the same way as you have watched Him go into heaven." Why are you gazing into heaven? This same Jesus who is taken up from you shall so come in like manner as you have seen Him go into heaven."

## Two kinds of people
